	Design & Technology	Making Fruit Kebabs – Explore and investigate a healthy diet using the eat well plate model. Use instructions to make a healthy fruit snack.
	Computing	Coding- Explain that an algorithm is a set of instructions to complete a task and plan an algorithm so it will work when made into code. Design a simple program using 2Code that achieves a purpose and find and correct some errors in the program, say what will happen in a program and spot something in a program that has an action or effect.
Place & Time	Geography (Kapow)	Hot and Cold Places - Name and locate the seven continents, the North and the South Poles and the Equator on a world map. Describe some similarities and differences between the UK and Kenya. Investigate the weather, writing about it using key vocabulary and explaining whether they live in a hot or cold place. Recognise the features of hot and cold places and locate some countries with hot or cold climates on a world map.
